MINISTER'S LETTER – FOR JANUARY 2024:



REMEMBER THAT NEW YEAR RESOLUTION YOU MADE TO TRY NEW THINGS?

A wit once said that a New Year's resolution is something that goes in one year and out the other.

Some of us have celebrated far more 'New Years' than others, but I guess we always hope for the same things. I gave up making resolutions long ago, my stock answer being "My New Year's resolution is not to make a resolution"! I never kept them, and always felt disappointed when I failed yet again.

I'm writing this just before I preach my sermon on 'intentions rather than resolutions', asking if we, instead of making one-time resolutions, made ongoing intentions to grow closer to God and to each other.

J.I. Packer, a Christian author, once said, "Once you become aware that the main business that you are here for is to know God, most of life's problems fall into place of their own accord." Isn't that wonderful? Could it be that the best resolution, our most significant intention, is simply to know God more?

Resolutions are based on behaviour and targets, or goals, to aim for, whereas intentions are more a 'way of being' rather than 'doing'. Intentions are more about being open to twists and turns along life's journey – seizing unexpected opportunities rather than ignoring them because they take us away from the route we resolved to follow.

When we resolve to do something, we're deciding what we want to do. When we set an intention, we're deciding who we want to be. Powerful stuff.

Someone wrote, "This New Year's, I've resolved to lead a better life. Now all I have to do is find someone who will trade lives with me" which made me smile.
